Option 3: Open Workshop – Board Development Program

A Board Development Program Open Workshop is designed for the board members of non-profit and voluntary organizations, and it typically runs on a Saturday from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm. Board members from a variety of organizations are encouraged to register.

The Open Workshop covers issues that concern all boards of incorporated non-profit societies including:

- identifying ethical and legal responsibilities of boards and board members
- understanding roles and responsibilities within your organization
- formulating responsive policies
- developing and making the best use of working committees
- supporting strong board and senior staff relationships or ensuring that the work of the organization gets done if there is no senior staff
- recruiting, orienting, training and evaluation of board members

Since the Open Workshops are **designed for board members**, it is most helpful to try and reach these members directly when advertising the workshop. You may want to contact the Executive Director of the organization since this is often the staff member that has the most contact with the board. **Executive Directors themselves are also encouraged to attend**, particularly if they are able to attend with a board member.

Open workshops work best with an attendance of between **10 and 25 participants**. We encourage sponsors to limit attendance from a single group to three to four participants to prevent one group dominating the discussion. If a single group wants to register more than this number of participants, we would be happy to speak with them and book a Fundamentals Workshop for their organization.

Sponsoring groups are encouraged to charge a nominal fee for the workshop to offset the costs of lunch and registration. Since the Board Development Program's services are free of charge, we ask that if there is a charge for the workshop, it be clearly indicated that the charge is for these items.
